

WINTER SCHOOL

Qualification: Foundations in Christian Life and Service (Level 3)

Term 1: September-December Term 2: January-March

A twenty-two week course that will deepen your relationship with Jesus and your knowledge of the Bible.

The Winter School programme gives you the opportunity to focus on your relationship with Jesus, study the Bible in depth and practically apply it to your life. We are confident that you will leave better equipped to live the Christian life and serve in your local church context.

The main content of the course is taught by experienced and gifted teachers, resulting in the award of a widely recognised qualification. You will study as part of a wonderful international community in a stunning location with great facilities. Your fees also cover all accommodation, on-site social activities and meal costs.

You will be taught from a wide range of biblical books and a variety of theological topics through lectures, and there will be a number of seminars dealing with the practical aspects of the Christian life.



You will also have regular 'Route Planner' sessions providing an overview of every Old Testament book which tracks your weekly Bible reading schedule. There will be opportunities to talk with others about what you have been learning through your Family Group, Interactive Group and New Testament Discussion Group.

SPRING SCHOOL

Qualification: Principles in Christian Life and Service (Level 3)

Dates: April-June

A ten week course that gives you time to get to grips with the Bible and deepen your relationship with the Lord Jesus.

Spring Bible School is a great chance to study the Bible at a deep level for a relatively short space of time. At just ten weeks long, you could fit the course into a study break, sabbatical from work, or as part of your gap year. It is ideal for anyone who wants to develop their relationship with Jesus, gain a better understanding of the Bible and practically apply it to life.

The main content of the course is taught by experienced and gifted teachers leading to an externally validated qualification. You will live amongst a diverse group of fellow Christians in a beautiful part of the English countryside.

You will be taught directly from the Bible and cover a number of theological topics. You will have regular Route Planner sessions which will provide an overview of every New Testament book which will follow your weekly Bible reading plan. There will also be plenty of time for deeper discussions within the various student groups that you will be a part of during your stay.

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A DEEPER EXPERIENCE

Capernwray has made the Bible so much more relevant to me in my life. Studying at both Winte and Spring School has given me a great opportunity to think, reflect deeply on life, and make the right decisions about what to do next.

BIBLE TEACHING

Our number one focus at Capernwray is telling people about Jesus and equipping them to serve within his Church. This means the Bible is our core focus of teaching material and provides the foundation for all our theology.

As a result, all our lectures are based on faithful exposition of the Scriptures; we dig both deep and wide into God's word, and we try to strike a good balance between Old and New Testaments. Our overall approach recognises the need for both systematic theology and biblical studies.

We also cover many practical topics about the Church and Christian life, addressing key contemporary theological issues including:

- The Authority of Scripture
- The Father Heart of God
- Personal Evangelism
- Union with Christ
- The Holy Spirit
- Church History
- World Religions
- World Mission
- The Church
- Worship
- Prayer
- Eschatology

We feel that it is vitally important that our biblical teaching is not separated from the demands and challenges of everyday life. Consequently the majority of our visiting bible teachers come from a variety of current or recent ministry backgrounds. Although their roles may range from local church pastors to international evangelists, they all bring a wealth of personal experience which enriches their teaching and practically equips the students.

COMMUNITY LIVING

As a student, you'll live in a loving and caring community of over 150 fellow students and around 50 members of staff. We hope the experience will transform you, and most people leave having made lifelong friends from around the world.

You will also be part of a Family Group, Interactive Group and New Testament Discussion Group, meeting each week. These groups are brilliant for building strong relationships.

Family Group will be led by two or three staff members, and will meet to pray and share together each Wednesday morning. Your group leader will look out for your well-being and be happy to talk over personal matters with you if you want to. Family group leaders also arrange occasional social events each term on a Friday evening.

Interactive groups will only have students in them, and will usually be made up of people from the same part of the world as you. They are a place to discuss issues that come up from studying, share thoughts and ideas about the content of the Bible, and a great opportunity to exercise leadership skills.

In Winter School the New Testament Discussion Groups look at Christian issues with a particular focus on the letters of Paul. These groups are also student-led and provide similar leading and learning opportunities as the interactive groups. They are vital in embedding learning that has arisen during lectures and help students form practical patterns for life based upon the Bible.

We want to do our utmost to care for you whilst you are with us and highly prioritise our Pastoral Care. Every one of us is different and we come from a range of backgrounds and with varied experience. You may come to Bible School with issues you are already aware of, or as you develop and deepen your relationship with Jesus, other issues may arise. We will assist you in any way we can.

Our overall aim is that you will feel like you have become part of a big family when you come to Capernwray, and that you feel supported and encouraged in your walk with God.



PROCLAIMING FREEDOM THROUGH THE LORD JESUS CHRIST FOR OVER 75 YEARS

The history of Capernwray Bible School is grounded in one man's desire to tell as many people as he could about the transforming presence and indwelling life of Jesus.

As the Second World War ended Major Ian Thomas, who was at the time serving with the British Army in Germany, was longing for a place where young people could come and hear clearly the claims of the Lord Jesus Christ in their lives. He sent a telegram to his wife, asking her to go and bid for Capernwray Hall at a local auction.

Mrs Joan Thomas reluctantly walked into Lancaster Town Hall on the day of the auction, little knowing or realising the full significance that the day was going to have for her family and for thousands of people from every corner of the world.

The successful purchase of Capernwray Hall meant that Major and Mrs Thomas could fulfil what they believed was God's new purpose for the property: to make it a place where young people could come and stay and be introduced to the Lord Jesus Christ.

The first ten guests from Britain arrived in May 1947, followed by a group of young Germans as part of an education programme funded by the British Foreign Office.

Through these visits many came to discover the life-transforming presence of Jesus Christ which led to the establishment of the Capernwray Missionary Fellowship of Torchbearers.

In the winter of 1949 a Bible School was founded to meet the needs of the many young Christians who had taken their first steps in the Christian faith at Capernwray. This soon became two separate intakes, Winter and Spring School, which now sees around 250 international students come through our doors each year.

What has always remained throughout this time has been the desire to keep proclaiming the transforming presence of the Lord Jesus Christ through biblical teaching and practical training. Our heartbeat continues to be the equipping of men and women for service in the church worldwide.











OUTREACH

We feel that it's absolutely vital that students transfer the Bible teaching and practical training they receive into real life situations. We facilitate this by giving all students regular opportunities to participate in local, national and international outreach activities.

The primary means for outreach is your attendance at a local church each Sunday. These will be assigned to you and will give you an opportunity to meet with Christians based in the UK.

More generally there will be numerous chances to participate in homeless ministry, attend senior citizen centres, Sunday Schools, youth groups, open air events, school assemblies, classes and Christian Unions. We have great relationships with many local churches and often partner with their ministries. Student teams sometimes conduct their services and there are also a number of outreach events that are held at Capernwray throughout the year including our annual Christmas Presentation and Open Days that serve our local community.

Finally, there is a also a specific 10-day outreach that takes place during the second term of Winter School in which all students work with a number of UK churches, with additional opportunities for national and international missions trips.

FACILITIES

There are many social areas around the site to spend time with others. The Lounge is a good place to chat with others. In the winter there is often a fire blazing and also a piano for you to play. We have a specific Games Room set aside for indoor games such as pool, air hockey and table football. It is also a good place to play board games or cards.

If you are looking for a more secluded space to read or study, we have two libraries which have, as well as the recommended books for your course, many Christian biographies and fiction to inspire and entertain you. The Quiet Room is also a set aside place to be still — to think, read, pray or study.

In the Sports Hall you can play football, basketball, cricket, hockey, volleyball and dodgeball. We also have outdoor facilities for football, netball, volleyball, croquet, shuffleboard, tennis, frisbee golf and outdoor chess. At certain times during the day you can access our own Swimming Pool and Sauna.

All teaching takes place in our Conference Hall where everyone has their lectures together. It is also a good place to study in the afternoons when you have free time.

We believe that eating together is a vital part of living together as a community of believers. Everyone gathers three times a day in our Dining Hall to eat — both to refuel physically and also to build friendships and relationships. In between meals, we also serve light snacks, home-made treats and drinks.

Our students come from around the world, and so does our wide range of hot and cold dishes. They're generally served with salad, fresh fruit and water, with tea and coffee also available.

Sharing a bedroom with other students is a great opportunity to get to know them and their culture, and build lasting friendships. In most cases you will probably be in a room with three or four other students. There are also a few single rooms, two-bedded rooms and some larger ones. When we allocate rooms we'll take your age into account.

Most rooms include:

- Sink and wash basin
- Desk and writing area with chair
- Storage for clothes
- Bedside table and lamp
- All bedding provided

Many rooms have spectacular views over the Capernwray estate.

Our Grounds and Gardens are a great place to walk and talk with others or just sit and admire the beauty of creation that surrounds the Hall. There is a walking loop that takes you through the 175 acre grounds including many sheep-filled fields that offer an inspiring opportunity to ponder the farming metaphors often employed in the Bible. There are also plenty of benches scattered throughout our wonderful gardens to enjoy at any time of the year.










Experience life at Capernwray, learn alongside other students and be equipped for all that God has for you in your church, place of study or work.
